After dinner with the "family" that adopted me (the children's home is set up into families with parents), I helped tutor the Class 6's in math. They must have learned something because they wanted me to teach them again on Saturday!

After lunch I iced the birthday cakes. 3 cakes made enough to give each kid (over 70) a little piece. There was not enough powdered sugar for the icing so I added flour and it turned out great. All of the kids gathered in the evening for the monthly birthday celebration and dinner.

Sunday, after church, I took polaroid pictures of the families. In the afternoon there was a football match between the borders at the school and the kids of the children's home. Some of the girls braided my hair while we watched.



The evening consisted of two dinners (one with the kids and one with the team at the training center) and then a movie with the kids. Then a delightful conversation about international development with like minded people.

Monday morning I helped bake bread again, including delicious cinnamon rolls. I was able to get a ride back to town after lunch.

Tuesday morning Aaron and I went to the deaf school but found out that the term had ended but we had not been informed. I then went to the post office and picked up a package from a friend! As I had a bit of time I stopped by the library in town. It's pretty small but they had quite a few agriculture development books. Then on to my dentist appointment. Got a filling. Took a nap. Slurped down some ramen noodles.
